

Then I was granted an opportunity that has changed the trajectory of my life: I was offered the Presidential Leadership Scholarship. This scholarship has allowed me to not worry about debt after graduation. Now I can use my time in college to explore different academic connections. I get to see how theatre interacts with issues like climate change and social justice.



The Payne Family Impact Scholarship, established with a significant \$7.5 million gift from Iongtime UM supporters Terry and Patt Payne in November 2021, supports hundreds of Montana high school students whose families earn too much to secure large financial aid packages such as Pell Grants. but don't have the resources to outright pay for college. More than 170 students received a Payne Family Impact Scholarship to support their 2022 academic year.

or more than three decades. Kent Hamer owned the Clinton Market. located a short drive east on I-90 from Missoula. To Hamer, the market was much more than a gas station and grocery store, it was a place to build relationships with customers who became lifelong friends.

He sold the business in 2020 and will continue to serve his community into retirement. In November 2021, he announced a significant gift through a trust that will create the Kent Hamer Emergency Support Fund as well as merit- and needbased scholarships for Missoula College students. Hamer's generosity will provide financial assistance for students pursuing occupational and technical degrees in fields such as industrial technology, health care and culinary arts.

Hamer chose to establish both an emergency support fund and scholarships at Missoula College so he could help a diverse population of students afford two-year degrees and work toward trade careers.

ative American voices are elevated at UM through a fund established by Lois Welch to honor her late husband. acclaimed author James Welch. Her gift, announced in November 2021, allows UM to invite a prominent Native American writer to campus to teach each spring semester. In the future, the position will become endowed through a significant gift included

in Welch's estate plan. The endowment means her gift will be invested and the earnings made available to support the program in perpetuity.

In February 2022, UM earned R1 status. becoming one of the top 4% of research universities in the nation. UM's incredible research growth is advancing the reach of human knowledge and also creates jobs and companies in Montana.

alph and Norma Hartse were beloved Montana educators who taught students more than music they inspired young musicians to strive for excellence in all areas of life.



The Hartses are remembered by their former Custer County High School students, the Miles City community and fellow musicians across the country for the values they embodied and instilled, including teamwork, persistence and

discipline. Through their teaching careers, these UM alumni built a respected legacy that lives on today.

In 2021 their daughter Dr. Kristyna Hartse honored their legacy by creating the Ralph J. and Norma M. Hartse Endowed Professor of Bands at UM's School of Music. The Hartse Professorship, which will be fully funded by 2025, will provide salary support for a faculty member who is a director of bands, including concert band, symphonic wind ensemble, jazz band and marching band.



This professorship signals a new era for the School of Music. It honors the deep impact inspired music educators can make and will ensure our exceptional Bands Program continues for generations to come.

M launched its Military and Veteran Services Office (MVSO) in November 2021 to better elevate UM's active duty military members, veterans and military families. Help UM Better Serve Our Students and Communities

UM is in the midst of the largest infrastructure refresh in the history of our campus with upgrades underway to residence halls, learning spaces, dining and athletic facilities, and the groundbreaking of a new museum. These new and improved spaces, made possible by public funding and donor gifts, will benefit generations of UM students, faculty, staff and the many communities UM serves.



We are grateful for all that you make possible at the University of Montana – this year and for years to come.

M's School of Music is the nexus of learning, performance and creativity for UM students, as well as thousands of community members. Over the past year, the Music Building received some much-needed upgrades, and more are planned. Renovations to the choir and band rehearsal rooms as well as individual student practice rooms were completed in 2022, thanks to the generosity of three UM alumni and longtime supporters who donated \$3 million. With additional private support, future renovations will include updating classrooms and practice rooms with integrated audio-video systems, flexible furnishings, new lighting fixtures and windows, and soundproofing.



The School of Music serves the state of Montana as a hub for music education, with its Music Education Program boasting a 100% graduate job placement rate.





Construction is underway on a new home for the Montana Museum of Art and Culture, bringing together items from the Museum's Permanent Collection that have not been displayed in decades. A new 17,000-square-foot building for

the museum will be finished this fall. With three levels for galleries, climate-controlled storage and preservation space and education and public event areas, the new LEED-Certified building will be a campus landmark and a beacon for the arts in our community.

The aim of this facility is to build the first permanent home for this significant art collection in its history. Secondly, the building will provide spaces that allow us to fulfill our mission as a teaching and research institution and invite the public to enjoy these beautiful and compelling collections.
